"Absolutely Incredible" landmark for B30 Foodbank

Five Years of Donations worth £440,000



Roger Collins: an "absolutely incredible" landmark but "gaping chasms in the welfare state".

B30 Foodbank has just reached the "absolutely incredible" landmark of providing those in need with a quarter of a million kilograms of food since the centre opened five years ago. That volume of donated food represents around one million meals at an estimated value of £440,000.

Foodbank founder Roger Collins praised the support given to the most vulnerable in society by the people of South Birmingham and beyond. "I think it's absolutely incredible that we've reached this landmark if you bear in mind all that food has been given voluntarily. People's commitment to dealing with those in these terrible situations is fantastic."

In September 2013, the foodbank came into operation with 3000 Kg of stock. In the first year, about 2600 people were provided with a three-day supply of emergency food. "When we first started out, we had no idea how it was going to go," Roger explained.

Demand has consistently increased, and in the last 12 months, 8500 people received support. Now, the foodbank sometimes provides 1500 Kg of food in a single week.

This latest landmark is also tinged with sadness. "Demand is going up, and I just see no end to it to be honest," Roger said. "It is very depressing bearing in mind the foodbank shouldn't be there in the first place. There are gaping chasms in the welfare state. It is not supporting those in real need."

Roger said that demand for emergency food has increased by 12% since last year and that, as universal credit starts to have an impact on South Birmingham, there could be even greater need in the future.

Service: "Destitution by Design"

The annual foodbank dedication service takes place on Sunday October the 7th at 6.30pm at The Cotteridge Church. The theme of the service is "destitution by design". People of all religions and none are very welcome.

On a similar theme, the government's planning an investigation into whether its own policies are to blame for the sharp rise in the use of food banks. And B30 Foodbank has been approached by the DWP as a potential contributor to the research.

CoCoMad Festival Delivers Again

Bournville Labour Party raised another £500 for the foodbank with its latest tombola stall at this year's CoCoMad festival. And once again, the sum was matched



by the Co-Op. Their bumper 636Kg shop is much needed: since January, the foodbank has taken in 45.7 metric tons of food but given out 55.9 tons.

New measure of UK poverty


Meanwhile, the number of ultra rich people on the planet - with more than \$30M in assets - has increased by 12% to 255,810

B30 Foodbank's annual report has revealed an increase of 226% in the number of people needing emergency food supplies in 2018, compared to when the foodbank opened in 2013.

Benefit changes and delays are still the main reasons people need help. Despite the myths that foodbanks are crammed with huge families, nearly half of all B30 Foodbank's clients are single. A quarter are single parents.
